Bequest leaves lasting impact for nursing students and experienced professionals

"A society grows great when old men plant trees whose shade they know they shall never sit in." (Greek Proverb)

A dairy farmer in the Burton, New Brunswick area, the late Eugene Burpee was an honest man who from childhood lived the hard-working life of a farmer. Remembered by those who knew him for his generous nature, he loved to help his friends and his community.

In 1984, he received a Bicentennial Farm award to commemorate the five generations of dedicated family members who had created and operated the Pine Grove Holsteins dairy farm for 200 years.

Grateful for the compassionate care he received as a patient, he directed a portion of his estate to Horizon's Dr. Everett Chalmers Regional Hospital Foundation to fund scholarships for nursing staff. Three scholarships are available annually to nurses just starting their education and those looking to advance their careers.

Mr. Burpee's bequest has had annual impact for nursing students and experienced professionals since his passing in 2008. We are grateful to Mr. Burpee planting the tree under which nurses benefit from its shade.
